THE MIKE YARROW ADVENTUROUS EDUCATION AWARD 2010

Clarence "Mike" Yarrow (DS25 CB28 TA28) led the establishment and operation of the Pasadena Branch of Telluride Association, which operated from 1947 to 1952. In addition to his Telluride activities, Mike was a committed Quaker who worked for world peace in many capacities, at home and abroad. A number of Pasadena Branch alumni and friends have recently worked to establish the Mike Yarrow Adventurous Education Award in his memory, to enable Telluride branchmembers to pursue summer educational projects that reflect his spirit.

The award, of up to \$3,000, is designed to allow the recipient to undertake a non-paying, public service activity during the summer that is outside of an academic institution and clearly reflects Mike Yarrow's interests in peace and service to humanity. The award recipient must be either a current member of a Branch of Telluride Association or a Deep Springs student who will be entering a Branch the following year.

He or she must have a demonstrated commitment to Telluride Association and a clear need for summer earnings. Within one month of his or her return, the successful applicant will be required to summarize his or her summer activities in a report, which will stand as a record of the summer's accomplishments and will also be distributed to the Yarrow Award sponsoring group.

The recipient will be chosen by the Telluride Association Awards Committee, based on its consideration of the attached application. The application is due at the Telluride Office in Ithaca no later than **MARCH 10, 2010**.
